I. Purpose and Scope

1.1 Purpose

This ESF Annex provides the mechanism for the organization of law enforcement resources in Harvey County to respond to emergency situations exceeding normal law enforcement capabilities. Specifically, ESF 13 Public Safety and Security discusses:

- Emergency law enforcement and security activities;
- Operational and personnel security;
- Augmentation of local law enforcement resources;
- Law enforcement command and control structure;
- Coordination with state and federal law enforcement resources; and
- Liaison between response operations and criminal investigation activities.

1.2 Scope

This ESF includes information that addresses: 1) the four phases of emergency management; 2) stakeholders including those with functional and access needs and children; 3) incident management procedures including organizational charts, as appropriate; and 4) all hazards planning. This ESF Annex applies to all County, City and participating agencies with assigned emergency responsibilities as described in the Section 3, Responsibilities.

The ESF 13 resources support state and local authority's efforts to address:

- Command, control, and notification including the roles of county and city agencies with emergency responsibilities and their working relationships with the volunteer agencies providing emergency management services;
- A flexible organizational structure capable of meeting the varied requirements of many emergency events with the potential to require activation of the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and implementation of the Emergency Operations Plan (EOP);
- Force and critical infrastructure protection.
- Security planning and technical assistance.
- The understanding that agencies assigned emergency responsibilities have existing emergency plans and procedures. ESF 13 is not designed to take the place of these plans, rather it is designed to complement and support the departmental staffing and procedures already in place.

II. Concept of Operations

This section provides a narrative description summarizing the concept of operations for the following ESF 13 activities. 1) Command, Control, and Notification, 2) Capabilities, 3) Public Safety/Security/Protection, and 4) Continuity of Operations. The narrative portions of this section provide summarized overviews for the topics listed above. Section 3 provides the

detailed actions organized by agency detailing their ESF 13 responsibilities.

Throughout the response and recovery periods, ESF 13 will evaluate and analyze information requests to move people, materials, equipment and other resources as necessary; develop and update assessment of the Law Enforcement situation and status in the impact area; and undertake contingency planning to meet anticipated demands or needs.

When an event is focused in scope to a specific type or response mode; technical and subject matter expertise may be provided by an appropriate person(s) from a supporting agency with skills pertinent to the type of event, who will advise and/or direct operations to meet the context of the Incident Command System structure.

The Harvey County Sheriff's Office provides law enforcement in the unincorporated areas of the county. Police departments in the cities of Newton, North Newton, Hesston, Halstead, Sedgwick, Burrton, and Walton provide law enforcement in their respective incorporated areas. The Harvey County Sheriff's Office can, and will, provide assistance in the incorporated areas of the county at the request of the Police Chief or Supervising Officer of the affected jurisdiction.

2.1 Command, Control, and Notification

When Emergency Management is notified of an event that requires the activation of the EOC, the EOC Manager (or their designee), in consultation with the County Administrator and emergency management staff will determine which Emergency Support Functions are required for activation in support of emergency operations.

In incidents originating as a public safety and security related emergency, and the needs cannot be met through existing plans and partnerships, requests for assistance will be forwarded from the Incident Commander to the Emergency Management Department informing them of the escalating situation with the potential to require activation of the (EOC). If ESF 13 made the initial request for EOC activation, it will automatically be activated.

If another primary event resulted in activation of the EOC and it is determined that ESF 13 will be activated, the EOC Manager will notify the designated Coordinating Agency, as appropriate, and request representatives to report to the EOC to attend an initial briefing regarding the situation.

Depending on the complexity or severity of the event, the Emergency Management Director, or designee, may advise the County Administrator that the need exists to declare a local emergency. For more information on a declaration of a local emergency, see the ESF 5 Annex.

The Coordinating Agency for ESF 13 is the Harvey County Sheriff Office. A representative from the Harvey County Sheriff Office (or designee) will report to

the EOC for all incidents involving ESF 13 activation in Harvey County. As additional EOC staffing needs become apparent, other agency representatives may be asked to report to the EOC to assist with public safety and security activities.

Once activated, the ESF 13 Coordinating Agency is responsible for contacting primary and support agencies with liaison roles as well as providing briefings and direction for initiation of activities for Public Safety and Security services in support of emergency operations.

The ESF 13 Coordinating Agency will:

Work with the EOC to rapidly assess the situation and take appropriate actions to support operations at the scene(s);

- Assess the need to request additional and/or specialized resources from outside Harvey County.
- Serve as the liaison to resources from outside the county, including State and Federal agencies.
- Establish and maintain operational awareness of public safety and security through direct communications links with public safety and security units in the field and/or their appropriate coordinating entities (PSAPs, liaisons, etc.)
- Conduct public safety and security disaster impact and needs assessments, prioritize ESF 13 operational objectives in alignment with the EOC Action Plan, and coordinate ESF 13 county-wide response activities.
- Manage the collection, processing, and dissemination of ESF 13 related information to and from the EOC.
- Receive, manage, & track resource requests for ESF 13; and
- Ensure full coordination of activities with other groups within the EOC to assist in the development and maintenance of a common operating picture.

2.2 Capabilities

2.2.1 Specialized Capabilities

The specialized capabilities for the Sheriff's Office include the Emergency Response Team (ERT), which is designed to provide specialized public safety services to local courts, corrections and law enforcement agencies, as well as to the community at large. The ERT has two primary objectives:

- To provide a systemic approach to saving lives in accordance with priorities of life and the specific standards set forth in concert with the totality of circumstances presented.
 - While life safety is a priority of ERT, the specific circumstances will dictate the level of force necessary to reasonably protect the public

and the officers involved. Resolution of some incidents may require the specific application of various levels of force, up to and including, deadly force.

2.2.2 Capabilities Available

There are no helicopter units or aerial search capabilities in Harvey County. The Kansas Highway Patrol has airborne police that service local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies and emergency service agencies. The Kansas Highway Patrol has three helicopters and one Cessna with Forward Looking Infrared which allows pilots to search for persons at night by sensing body heat.

The Kansas Intelligence Fusion Center (KIFC), a joint operation of the Kansas Attorney General, Kansas Bureau of Investigation, the Kansas Highway Patrol and the Kansas National Guard, which focuses on counterterrorism. Fusion centers compile, analyze, and disseminate criminal, homeland security, and terrorist information and intelligence, as well as information regarding public safety, law enforcement, fire, public health, social services, public works, etc. This intelligence and information is both strategic (i.e. is designed to provide guidance on general trends) as well as tactical (i.e. is intended for a specific event) and is collected on an ongoing basis.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) has a Field Intelligence Group and has partnerships with the Kansas City Joint Terrorism Task Force (JTTF) and the InfraGard, an FBI-established association of businesses, academic institutions and law enforcement agencies.

2.2.3 Harvey County Drone Program

The Harvey County Drone Program is a joint program with Harvey County Sheriff Department and Newton Police Department. Harvey County Sheriff Department owns the drone but is available to be utilized by both city and county pilots. The drone can be utilized to obtain information relating to damage and other all hazards situations. The drone is available to all Harvey County entities by request via Harvey County Communications. The drone has high definition visual, thermal imaging capabilities and live stream capabilities through a private YouTube network. The drone can carry a spotlight and a speaker for communication reasons.

Newton Police Department has a drone, however, it is not currently set up for use.

2.2.4 Harvey County Drug Task Force

The Drug Task Force is a joint operation coordinated by the Harvey County Sheriff Office and Newton Police Department. The partnership with all Harvey County Law Enforcement agencies with specialized training focused on drug crime, surveillance, undercover operations, managing cooperating individuals,

and purchasing narcotics as well as a focused approach on prosecuting high level drug offenders.

The drug task force has the capacity to work with other city, county, state and federal entities. The goal of the drug task force is to reduce drug sales and other crimes associated with using and selling narcotics.

2.3 Public Safety/Security/Protection

Public safety and security coverage during emergencies will vary greatly depending on the event, but may include:

- Providing traffic and crowd control;
- Controlling access to operational scenes and evacuated areas;
- Preventing and investigating crimes; and
- Providing security for critical facilities and supplies.
- Protect life and property during civil unrest incidents

During large incidents, or incidents that continue over several operational periods when local public safety and security resources exceed the capability of local law enforcement agencies, mutual aid may be requested. ESF 13 will work with its support agency counterparts to seek and procure, plan, coordinate and direct the use of required assets.

During response, local law enforcement agencies are responsible for provision of security at incident command posts and staging areas within their own jurisdictions. The operations section of the local law enforcement will determine the most suitable method for securing and protecting areas. Incident specific objectives will consider the type of disaster and any special cascading effects of the disaster such as areas contaminated by hazardous materials and/or the need for evidence preservation in events suspected to have been caused by criminals or terrorists. In addition, the ESF 13 coordinator will evaluate and coordinate with the jurisdictional law enforcement to provide security during disaster operations for key facilities/locations. The only correctional facility in Harvey County is the jail facility that is managed by the Harvey County Sheriff Office.

Local law enforcement, in coordination through ESF 13 may be asked or required to provide safety and security at the following location:

- Emergency Operations Center: at the request of the Emergency Management Director;
- Field Command Posts: at the request of the Incident Commander
- Staging Areas: at the request of the Incident Commander
- Lodging and Feeding Facilities: at the request of the Incident Commander from facility Personnel
- Public Shelter security will be handled first by the agency in which the shelter is located
- Registered sex offenders, parolees or other offenders required to report to local, state or federal law enforcement entities will not be treated any differently.

- Law Enforcement, in conjunction with ESF 6-Mass Care, Housing and Human Services will maintain a list of those housed at these facilities for reference purposes.
- Temporary morgues: security will be provided in conjunction with ESF 6 -Health and Medical Services
- Hospitals: Newton Medical Center will provide routine security for their own facilities. In the event of an actual or threatened criminal act, or whenever facility security forces are deemed insufficient to ensure safety, the Incident Commander will direct law enforcement agencies in providing the necessary security.

The Incident Commander, through use of law enforcement agencies, is responsible for the protection and safety of all emergency responders.

The protection of responders is the responsibility of the local public safety and security organization. All police officers, firefighters, and emergency medical providers in the region have ready and immediate access to personal protective equipment, including respiratory protection, protective suits, medications and antidotes against common weapons of mass destruction (WMD) agents, and are trained to properly use this equipment.

2.4 Continuity of Operations

The departmental Continuity of Operations Plans will be implemented as needed. These plans describe procedures to get assistance when overwhelmed and list alternate locations to operate from when their facility is damaged and unavailable.

III. Actions and Responsibilities

3.1 Actions

Actions carried out by ESF 13 are grouped into phases of emergency management: Preparedness, Response, Recovery and Mitigation. Each phase requires specific skills and knowledge to accomplish the tasks and requires significant cooperation and collaboration between all ESF 13 agencies and the intended recipients of service.

4	Provide documentation for possible financial reimbursement process for recovery activities.
5	Participate in after action meetings and prepare after action reports as requested.
6	Clean, repair, replenish and perform maintenance on all equipment before returning to normal operations or storage.
